Father, I ask You this morning to give me words of life, words of substance, as I share Your truth. Lord, I ask this in the name of Jesus. Amen.

You see, the message on my heart this morning is immense it's about how God has a plan for me, for you, for each one of us. When I think about the fact that God has a plan for me, it fills me with awe. The Creator of the universe has ordained that I am His child. It's mind-blowing, isn't it?

All roads lead to my heart as far as God is concerned. My salvation started in my heart when I surrendered and gave my life to Him. And the amazing thing is, it didn't just start with me. Wow! it began in God's heart. My connection with God is heart-to-heart.

I think of David in the Bible—it was said of him that he had a heart like God's. Imagine that! I am created in God's image. I can't even comprehend the privilege of being in contact with the God who created everything—the stars, the planets, and all creation. His creative power is evident in everything around me.

Ecclesiastes 3:11 reminds me, *"He hath made every thing beautiful in his time: also he hath set the world in their heart, so that no man can find out the work that God maketh from the beginning to the end.."* There's beauty in me because I am His creation, fearfully and wonderfully made. God has placed eternity in my heart. I'm aware of eternity, and it's not something to fear; it's part of my identity as a child of God.

When I think of eternity, I can't fully grasp it: it's a realm beyond my human understanding. But I know it's a spiritual place, where I'll have a new body and be like Him. The Bible says that when I see Him, I'll see Him as He truly is. What an incredible promise!

Jeremiah 29:11 is one of my favorite verses: *"For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."* God's plan for my life is good. When I reflect on my journey, I can see how He orchestrated every step that brought me to Him.

I remember the moment I came to know Jesus. Looking back, I see how God placed people and situations in my life to lead me to Him. It was all part of His perfect plan. It wasn't by accident; it was His intentional love for me.

1 Corinthians 2:9 says, *"Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor has it entered into the heart of man the things which God has prepared for those who love Him."* I can't even imagine the things God has prepared for me, but I trust Him completely.

Psalms 139:16 reminds me, *"That God saw my unformed substance, and all my days were written in His book before one of them came to be."* He has fashioned my days, and even when I face challenges, I know He has a purpose in them.

Proverbs 3:5-6 has become my guide: *"Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will direct your paths."* I've learned to trust Him, even when I don't understand. When I let go of my need to control my life and surrender to Him, He directs my steps in ways I never could have imagined.

Romans 8:28 reassures me: *"And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose."* Even when things don't make sense, I hold onto the truth that God is working everything out for my good.

God's timing is perfect. He's never late, and He's never early. He's always right on time. I believe that I am here, right now, for such a time as this. Just like Esther in the Bible, God has placed me where I am for a reason. God said to Esther in Esther 4, 14. *"For if you remain silent at this time, relief and deliverance for the Jews will arise from another place, but you and your father's family will perish. And who knows but that you have come to your royal position for such a time as this?"*

I am part of His plan, and that fills me with hope and joy. It's a privilege to walk with Him daily and to be used by Him to make an impact. Even the small, faithful steps I take can create ripples far greater than I can see.

One day, I'll stand in His presence. One day, I'll be like Him. Until then, I will keep walking in faith, trusting that He is guiding my steps and fulfilling His planned purpose in my life.

Isn't it wonderful to be part of what God has planned?

REFLECTIONS ON THE ELDER SON

The story of the Prodigal Son is one we've heard countless times. For many of us, it's one of the first parables we learn in Sunday school, often presented as a standalone tale of repentance, forgiveness, and love. But recently, I was reminded of the layers this story holds—layers that challenge us not just to reflect on others but to examine our own hearts.

A few months ago, I visited a dear friend in Romania. Our friendship started years ago because of our shared faith, and every time we meet, we talk about our spiritual journeys. During this visit, we found ourselves discussing the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32) - not from the perspective of the son who wandered and returned, but through the eyes of the elder brother. It was a conversation that left us both reflecting deeply on things we had never considered before.

When we think about the elder brother, his story often feels less relatable than the dramatic journey of his younger sibling. But as I read the parable again, I realized how much of myself I could see in him. Like him, I've often tried to "do the right thing" and follow the rules, expecting, perhaps unconsciously, that this would earn me some kind of reward from God. The elder brother's anger and frustration made sense to me. He had worked hard, stayed loyal, and never strayed—so why wasn't that enough?

Yet, Jesus challenges this perspective in the parable. The father's response to his elder son wasn't to dismiss his feelings but to gently remind him: "All that I have is yours." It was a reminder that the father's love and generosity weren't tied to performance but were freely given. The elder brother's struggle wasn't about justice; it was about the condition of his heart.

I've been reflecting on how often I serve God with a heart that's focused on what I can receive rather than simply desiring to know Him. Do I worship Him for His blessings or because I truly love Him and want to reflect His image in the world? This parable reminded me that, like the elder brother, I can be "good" outwardly while my heart is still distant from God.

The beauty of this story is that it reveals the father's love for both sons. The younger son, who represents obvious rebellion, receives grace and restoration. And it sounds like, you know God telling us that it doesn't matter how far away from him we are, or how far away we move from Him, that we are always welcome in His Kingdom. And I think that is very true, and that's very important for us to understand that, you know there's nothing we can do that can separate us from the love of God, and He is always waiting with open arms, and He's always going to welcome us back into his fold when we have gone astray.

But the elder son, whose struggle is hidden behind a façade of obedience, is also invited to the feast. The open-ended nature of the parable asks us a question: Will we enter the celebration, letting go of our pride and self-righteousness, or will we stand outside, unwilling to accept the grace freely given to others?

This reflection leads me to consider not just how I relate to God but also how I see others. Am I quick to rejoice when someone who has wandered finds their way back, or do I, like the elder brother, struggle to celebrate their return? God's kingdom is for everyone, and His love isn't measured out—it's poured out abundantly for all who come to Him, regardless of their journey.

Ultimately, the story of the Prodigal Son is a call for self-reflection. It asks us to look at our hearts and ask why we serve God. Is it for what He gives, or is it because we want to know Him, love Him, and reflect Him in our lives?

This week, I invite you to sit with this parable. Whether you see yourself in the younger son, the elder brother, or both, take a moment to reflect on God's unending grace. He welcomes us home no matter how far we've wandered, but He also calls us to examine our hearts, to lay down our pride, and to join the celebration.

May we all draw closer to the Father—not for what He gives but simply because of who He is. And may we embrace others with the same love, knowing that together, in our differences, we reflect the fullness of God's image.

We sincerely thank all who have supported the AskOf Orphanage, especially during James' recent health challenges. His recovery has required both time and financial aid, and your generosity in covering medical costs has been invaluable.

Your support, both financial and spiritual, has been a blessing not only for James' ministry but also for the AskOf children in our care. With your continued help, we can extend our mission to reach

even more children in need. For years, our Accra-based home has provided shelter, education, and care to children across Ghana. Many have since transitioned into independent lives—some reuniting with family, others securing jobs in the city. Notable success stories include George and Gifty, now working at Kempinski Hotel Accra, and Raphael, pursuing software engineering.

As we move forward, we are shifting to a community-based support model, focusing on aiding children within their own environments rather than bringing them to our facility. This change ensures they receive essential resources while staying connected to their families and communities. Already, children like Richard, Richmond, Solomon, Adiza, and Miriam are thriving under this model, benefiting from both practical assistance and a strong sense of belonging. This transition marks a new chapter in our mission—empowering more children while strengthening community ties.

We are introducing this approach to help children thrive within their communities by providing: access to clothing, food, and a small stipend. Helping children enroll in local schools or vocational training. We visit monthly visits to ensure well-being and offer ongoing support. This new approach allows us to reach more children while reducing costs, keeping them connected to their families and communities.

We sincerely thank our supporters for their generosity in helping countless children. We also appreciate those assisting James through his health challenges. His recovery depends on costly medications, and your continued support is invaluable. Together, we can make a lasting impact.

James is always happy to share about God's work that he and Theresa are doing in Accra, but doesn't always tell us about the sacrifices and the financial hardship they have to overcome. The most important thing we can do is to continue to uphold them both in prayer, particularly for a full recovery for James. Their other need is financial. James medication costs up to £200 each month. On top of this is the cost of running the Orphanage including supporting the young people back in their Community. CULTIVATING A PRAYING SPIRIT

I have been a born again believer since my pre teens but one thing I have always struggled with is taking my problems to God especially during difficult times. Naively, but rather arrogantly, going to God in times of trouble, demonstrated that I was approaching God with a list. I wanted God to know that in spite of my troubles I loved him all the same. We all experience peaks and troughs in our lives so during my peaks I would be seeking God and telling myself during the troughs that I had previously invested so would seldom spend time in prayer. I am not sure how I developed that theology, but up until recently years I was practicing that. Whether, I was subconsciously building barriers to prevent myself from experiencing overwhelming pain and hurt, I am yet to fully analyse that long episode of my life where my prayer life was attacked during difficulties.

About 18 months ago, I heard God calling me to pray, talk to Him about everything and spend time in His presence whether in joy or in sorrow, and in the good times or bad times. Initially, I found it hard because that call came when I was going through an especially challenging time. Easily, I found myself replying to God that I was in a tough time, feeling overwhelmed and did not know how to express myself and for Him to look at my prayer bank to make the situation better. As clear as day, I heard Him say that, he wanted me in the here and now, forget about the past prayers and stay in His presence. In that wrestle, I again heard His voice clearly that he would wake me up even when I was tired to spend time with him. I grudgingly agreed.

He is a loving gracious Father who runs to meets us and embraces us when we take a step towards Him. I can joyfully say that He has been true to His word. He has consistently woken me up to spend time with Him. I have suddenly found words to express myself to Him because He has enabled me to. I have found joy in situations which I had felt overcome by. In various situations, He has demonstrated His power. I have now learned to respond to Him. For example, when I'm woken up, I go along with what he puts in my spirit. It can be a hymn so I will sing it over and over, meditate on the words and pray it back to Him. It can be a scripture. It can be a person who drops in at the time of waking up. That is the Holy Spirit prompting me to bring that soul before Him.

A few months ago, after waking up at 4am, my thoughts were suddenly on my son. He came shortly after that to say he was doing an airport pick up. I felt I needed to go on my knees and pray for Him for preservation of life. 10mins after doing exactly that, he called me. He had been involved in an accident and His life had been spared. God saved and protected Him. God answers our prayers instantly. I have learned that God helps us to discern things that might happen when we seek Him so we can declare His goodness into those situations. I am a bit of a dreamer too. However, for some years, the dreams dried up. During these moments that I am seeking God, those have returned. Sometimes they are cryptic. I am certain God wants me to spend more time in His presence by giving me these tasters. My response is "Lord, speak to me clearly to me as I walk alongside you". I yearn to hear His voice as I daily walk with Him. I have learned that spending time in prayer helps us see our Father in personal dimensions that we are yet to imagine.

I would like to encourage everyone to make a commitment to daily and consistently seek God. We do that not in our own strength nor intellect but waiting on Him to lead, asking Him about what He wants to do or tell us, how He wants to order our steps daily to the glory of His name. He is the Master Gardener who cultivates in us a praying spirit so that we pray without ceasing as well as gives us the utterance to pray and what to pray about

'For God is working in you, giving you the desire and the power to do what pleases him.' (Phil 2:13, NLT)

Brothers and sisters, Romans. 14:17 says "For the kingdom of God is not meat and drink; but righteousness, and peace, and joy in the Holy Ghost". It's like a three legged table. There is a peace leg, a righteous leg and a joy leg.

Many have the peace of God but few have the joy leg. Without it the table collapses. My job is to bring the joy back into the Gospel. The joy comes into us and we cannot help ourselves. We feel so good. It's the Kingdom of Heaven coming within us. This joy is everlasting embrace it, receive it. It's a new anointing, the latter rain. Check it up in the Word and you will find it will fit. Made to measure. It's the love of God coming into our souls and changing our lives. It is the love of God being shed abroad in our hearts. We receive it and it flows out. It's lasted me 44 years and it's getting better.

God give a double portion of the Holy Ghost and fire to each one reading this so that they will never be the same again. Lift your hands now and praise God. Don't try to understand it, just embrace it. It's the Spirit of God. The end is everlasting life. I remember I had the joy of the Lord when I was first saved, but it kept dwindling. It came to a time when I could not get it back, and then God told me, the only way you are going to get delivered

Henri, is to start Praising. God told me there are certain things in your life, which have got to be put right, there are certain things you have to do.

When God's done all He can, we have to do something ourselves. I thought if only I could get back to the joy that I had, when Smith Wigglesworth was at Preston. I was down on my knees and the power of God was coming down, I was prayed for and it came on me and I couldn't stop. It was time for us to come home from Preston to Mansfield and they pulled me away. I've never forgiven them for it, because it was so lovely, so real and I was tasting something of heaven, That was in the 1930's, I came home with the joy of the Lord, but I didn't get right through into victory.

I never got another release like it, there were no Glory Meetings then. There were other meetings but they didn't hold me like that held me. Brothers and sisters how I longed to get back to that place for years and years, I had blessings, little ones, but not the lot. The joy came into my soul on occasions, but the people around me didn't encourage me, because they didn't know what was happening. Nobody bothered to help me enter into the Spirit and I didn't get right through again. God told me distinctly that I needed deliverance and that I had to make my mind up. It's not how good you can be that gets you to heaven, it's His precious blood.

It was in 1948 that I was restored to God. I'd been saved many years, but as we sang that old hymn "There's Power in the Blood" that same power delivered Henri. I was playing the piano in a "dead" Pentecostal prayer meeting. I was hungry so hungry, and the power of God hit me and I fell off the piano stool and started Holy Rolling. I couldn't speak English for a week I was on fire.

'There had to be some power in Jesus to deliver me. Brothers and sisters just as there is power in the blood there's power in Praising God that's what set me free. There's a big difference in this way, we can do nothing but submit ourselves to God. Repent and the times of refreshing shall come in your soul. I did exactly that and God told me, this is it, now start to praise me, you'll get rid of all the things you want to and I'll fill you with my wonderful Spirit. So I started to Praise God and He delivered me completely and I'm still praising Him. If you're really saved, sinners feel a difference in you. I'm a brand new man, I've found it, It's real. It's real.

I realised God had called me. When you have found God in a real way, you'll be put to the test and have to toe the line according to His word. Choose you this day whom, you will serve. Oh, I thank God, I chose God. I had a challenge in my life, I was called of God and I yielded to the Spirit of God. We constantly have to make decisions for God. I tell you, the joy and peace that comes in our souls when we say yes to Him. We are not our own, we are bought with a price, the precious blood of Jesus.

Oh God, I pray in the beautiful name of Jesus that you'll so move in old time power, on everyone who reads this, that they will give their all to serve Thee, with all their heart, to bring about a mighty Holy Ghost revival. Quicken every soul, that Thy will be done in every life.

I thank you Lord, for the years you have been with me and that I'm more excited today, than I've ever been in my life and I know it's getting better, I pray you'll do something wonderful in all our hearts. Help us to work out our own salvation, with fear and trembling, knowing that the King is coming and we are going to meet, Him, in all His glory.

WHEN GOD TURNS THE LIGHTS ON

I was asking the Lord to shine a new light on the Christmas story for me this year, and He did just that. Isaiah prophesied in Ch 9 v 2. "The people who walk in darkness have seen a great light.
