TEACH US TO PRAY LORD

Recently reading the book of Nehemiah I saw a clear similarity with today in the world and the Church. The Church has become unimportant in the nations eyes, and is neglected by the people. When Nehemiah heard of the condition of Jerusalem and the temple Neh I:3-4 He wept, fasted and prayed and he was very sad. There is a note of repentance in his prayer for how the nation of Israel had dealt corruptly with their status as the children of God. Oh how we need a spirit of repentance both in the Church and the Nations today. Nehemiah was King Artaxerxes cupbearer and the King asks in Neh 2:2 why he is so sad of countenance. Nehemiah says Neh 2:3, "Why should not my countenance be sad, when the city, the place of my fathers' sepulchres, Leith waste, and the gates thereof are consumed with

fire?" The king asks, "For what dost thou make request? So I prayed to the God of heaven". In the midst of the conversation, Nehemiah prays to God (wow). Its only then he asks for letters to the governors of Jerusalem to authorise him to go and rebuild the walls and the temple and also for materials from the king to do it. Neh 2:8, "And the king granted me, according to the good hand of my God upon me". 2:9 "Then I came to the governors beyond the river, and gave them the king's letters. Now the King had sent captains of the army and horsemen with me". What a wonderful answer to prayer Nehemiah not only had authority, he had an army to back him up and he would need it as we shall see. The people who were administering the area around Jerusalem were not happy that the city and temple should be rebuilt. They presented opposition, ridicule, reproach, conspiring against him and sent a false prophet. Nehemiah refused to be distracted telling them, "I am doing a great work and I cannot come down". He finished the job he made the city secure and rebuilt the temple in record time; all because he involved God in his prayer before he answered to the King.

When the people who had returned from Babylon more than 40,000 had settled in their villages and Jerusalem they all came to City. They gathered in the street and worshiped together to hear Ezra the priest read the Law from a wooden pulpit. When Ezra opened the Book to read they all stood up as he read; all the Levities among the crowd explained it clearly to those around them and Nehemiah and Ezra taught the people distinctly. The people confessed their sin against God and wept bitterly but Nehemiah said, "This day is Holy weep not; Go your way and, eat the fat and send portions to those who have nothing". "Neither be sorry for the Joy of the Lord is your strength. They made tent like booths and celebrated for seven days. Later they assembled themselves and separated themselves from strangers in sackcloth and confessed the sins of their fathers and worshipped God and renewed their Covenant with their Father. Joy is the product of true repentance and answer to prayer.

A large part of the success of the Nehemiah's revival was the instructional teaching of him and Ezra and also the Levities explanation from God's word. One of the issues in today's church is that there are many teachers but few fathers. Today It seems there are a multitude of people who are their own teacher, even you could say they are thier own do it yourself priest and prophet. Paul said in 2 Tim 4:3 "Teachers would have itching ears turning from the truth of the Gospel". Please make sure what your teaching is from the Bible not what you are itching to hear. Teaching is not an intellectual process but comes from a God given revelation and life style and is importantly one of the Holy Ghost anointed five fold gifts. Its a gift from God to the Church. Thank God we have been blessed in our fellowship with gifted, mature sound teaching as a foundation. Don't believe all you hear and read on the internet much of it is not God's revelation but Bible verses taken by unanointed people out of context and used to make the Gospel more palatable to people. We need to get back to the Bible truth.

I believe our Nations are bankrupt spiritually; we all need a fresh revelation from God. This stems from apathy towards prayer in the church. Prayer is not deemed an essential foundation of churches communal activity. Many consider prayer is just a list of wants and needs, true prayer is a deep fellowship with God, He wants us to pray not my will but Yours Lord. People in church today need to be taught how to pray as a cry from our hearts to God himself. It's a personal action talking one on one with God to touch His heart. The church needs to repent for its lack of awareness of how God feels about this! Could Covid be God's precursor to an awakening among us to bring us to our knees and pray as Nehemiah did. What we need is the cry from people's hearts for a restitution of God consciousness in our nations. To turn from the self-centred nature that pervades the majority of this generation.

Only prayer can bring the change necessary at this very dangerous time, things are getting worse. Nation is rising against nation; the times are being shortened! The signs are there in plain sight but I believe God is not finished with us yet and there will be one more great outpouring before Jesus returns for His own. We need to personally come to see, as Nehemiah saw, the desolation the crumbling walls the utter emptiness of temple where the supernatural presence of God is meant to be and break our hearts before God for our loss. A loss of the ability to reach the lost; that God would come down and restore His Church at this time. Sending the supernatural power of the Holy Spirit in the foreground not just the background. Let us pray, "Oh Father we need an outpouring of a fresh wave of your Glory revealed



ASK-OF GLORY ORPHANAGE



Here's an update from lames and Theresa.

The Lord has been gracious to us since the inception of the orphanage. We have seen many challenges, but the dawning of God's goodness always appears.

The lovely children have grown up so well, two have finished senior high school, George and Patience. Patience has returned to be with her wider family, while George is still with us, at the moment, looking for a job, We now have seven children in the senior high school in different regions across the Country, where they have been posted by the government through the Ghana Education Service. The cost of schooling and accommodation is covered by the government but we have had to pay for everything else for these young people including books and equipment needed for their courses, which can cost between £400-500 per pupil, and transport to and from wherever they are sent to, plus their daily living costs.

Throughout the time since the orphanage was established we have faced challenges. First with the accommodation, moving from one place to another, but God worked a miracle and found us a lovely large property close to the Church, that we own. After that the whole country was in black out, there was power outages but we got a generator. Later thieves came to the house to steal and one of the things they took away was the generator. We also regularly face difficulties in getting fresh water, so we have to buy water every other week, which we store in our large water barrels.

Having managed to overcome all the above, Covid arrived in 2020 and brought us greater challenges. It affects the orphanage, the school and the Church and it's activities. But God has been good, and through our generous supporters in the UK, he has provided for us. We are very grateful for your steadfast support, it means so much to us, and we pray God will richly bless you for both your financial and pray support.

The costs of food, utilities, medicine and most other things has risen, the economic situation has got worse, it is costing us twice as much each month to run the orphanage and provide for the children in senior high school. The school has been disrupted for all of the children and even when parts of the school have been allowed to be open, not all parents wanted their children to attend, which has meant less fees and therefore the need to subsidise the teachers pay. Priscilla, Gifty, Albert (all in their final year) Angela and Isabella remain at the Church school and are progressing well despite the difficulties.

James is looking forward to coming to the UK later this year, to personally thank you for the support you give us. Whilst being able to speak to you over Zoom has been wonderful, being with you is much more special.

These are the only words we can remember from an old glory chorus sang in the early meetings.

These words remain true to this day because it reminds us of the time when we saw the Glory of God being manifest through people sold out to God; they literally knew how to worship him in Spirit and in Truth. For us it was never the adoration of any man or work of men in spite of what the sceptics of the day implied.

This experience began for us in 1957 when Margaret was given a copy of the Glory news and posted it on to me, while I was away doing my National Service, I read and re read it many times the joy of the people came through the pages and resonated with my spirit.

I became a Christian following the Billy Graham Crusades and we often had fellowship with older folk in the evening church which Margaret's family attended. The people there would often tell us of the great times of revival they experienced mainly in the 1920s and 30s. They spoke of great times of rejoicing and joy in the meetings of powerful anointing's and signs following the word. There was little sign of these happening in our meetings at that time.

The first time I actually met the Glory Folk was in September 1957, I was travelling back from a holiday in Scotland when I became aware I could break my journey at Newark and resume the trip on the later train. It was Sunday so I found myself there knowing the folk met in the afternoon, but had no idea what the church was called or where it was. I asked the Salvation Army couple in the street and they told me if I carried on down the Appleton Gate past Brother Henri's shops I would hear them behind a brick wall. Intrigued I did just that and sure enough I heard singing, behind the wall was a St John's Ambulance hall home to the folk. One part of me wanted to go

on in, the other was to get back on the train and go home. I had not heard that sort of Worship before but anyway praise God I went in and spent an amazing afternoon. I was called out to share a greeting; the leaders obviously thought I needed prayer as I knelt at the front brother Bob Nichols and Lynette a Jamaican lady prayed for me with great gusto. A prophetic word was given that I was about to be set free and would remain so, also a promise from the scripture that the joy of the Lord will you be my strength. Scriptures I wasn't familiar with but later found in Nehemiah 8:10 and John 8:36 when I was looking to see if all this was biblical because I was receiving a lot of flak from the Christians when I got home. These verses have been in my heart and experience ever since.

In 1958 we visited the home of Sister Nelly Burnett who held Glory meetings in her home in Reading it was a kind of our outreach day and a number of folk new to the Glory Way were staying there.

Before things got really going It was discerned that a number of folk were not fully baptised in the Spirit. Sister Nelly had them all kneel down around her bed and praying for each one. The Holy Spirit fell in great power on them including Margaret who was soon to become my wife. So great was the power that we had a really hard task getting folk home late that night on the train back to London.

I confess I was highly embarrassed especially because also that afternoon at an open air meeting outside the main station many of those taking part seem incapable of standing up let alone to hold up the banners high.

Shortly after our marriage in 1959 we joined a small team to travel with Henri and Connie to Holland where we had rallies in several big cities in 1960.

We moved to live in Newark because Margaret was working full time in the Glory office with brother Bob: during that time many lifelong friendships were formed with some great people. We returned to London after our first child was born and continued the work there with Brother Archie Friday and others.

With a growing family and having no transport our live contact with the Glory folk became less frequent.

We'd however brought a reel to reel tape recorder from Henri a heavy huge thing often carrying it to people's homes to listen many people were blessed.

Many of the earlier Glory folk have now passed on and await the trumpet sound and my what a gathering there

Be thankful dear brothers and sisters we have been so blessed with just a little foretaste of what is to come later.

HE MAKETH A REBEL A PRIEST AND A KING

A few Sundays ago we were singing the hymn there was a line of the verse "He maketh the rebel a priest and a king" that struck me and has been with me since.

The first great rebellion was of course Satan who rejected God's authority and the privileged position he held in heaven.

Isaiah 14:12 - "How you have fallen from heaven, O day star, son of the dawn! You have been cut down to the ground, O destroyer of nations. You said in your heart I will ascend to the heavens; I will raise my throne above the stars of God. I will sit on the mount of assembly, in the far reaches of the north! I will ascend above the tops of the clouds; I will make myself like the Most High. But you will be brought down to Sheol, to the lowest depths of the Pit".

What a contrast to Jesus attitude. Phil 2:5 "Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus: who existing in the form of God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but emptied Himself, taking the form of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to death— even death on a cross. Therefore God exalted Him to the highest place and gave Him the name above

all names, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father".

Not content with his own demise Satan sought to deceive God's children, encouraging man's rebellion, causing them to doubt and question God's authority/ His Word. Gen 3:5-6 Did God really say that? and then appealing to the carnal nature -"for God doth know that in the day you shall eat it you shall be as God's, knowing good and evil. And the woman saw that the tree was good to eat, and pleasant to the eyes and a tree to be desired to make one wise... How tragic and devastating their action was apparently not seeing or cherishing the privileged position they were in either, enjoying the abundance of God's presence and the fullness of every good and perfect thing.

In the parable of the sower and the seed in Mark 4:15 Jesus warns us that this is Satan's way "and these are the ones by the wayside where the word is sown. When they hear it, Satan comes immediately and takes away the word that was sown in their hearts".

He knows that if only he can get us to doubt, ignore or even dismiss God's word he has disarmed us from the most powerful weapon we have, the very thing that can defeat him. Even Jesus didn't use any of his own thoughts or words when tempted by the devil in the wilderness. He used "it is written" at every temptation and the devil left him.

Psalm 107:17 says "fools, in their rebellious ways and through their iniquities suffered affliction". It's never going to turn out well for those in rebellion to God. He hates rebellion! He says it's as the sin of divination.

Divination means 'the practice of seeking knowledge of the future or the unknown by supernatural means'.

How arrogant and abhorrent that is at its very core, basically saying we reject your word, your authority, your will in favour of our thoughts and our will. We are generally seeking to benefit or exalt ourselves in some way. But in God's economy the way up is the way down and we need to humble ourselves under God's mighty hand that He may lift us up in due time. (I

Remembering the Tower of Babel the 'sons of men' rebelled against God's instruction to spread out, to be fruitful and fill the whole earth He knew the extent of their rebellion if they remained together.

But they said "let us build a city with a tower that reaches to the heavens that we may make a name for ourselves, and that we may not be scattered over the face of the earth". They were disassociating themselves from their creator.

Scholars believe Nimrod (Noah's great grandson) was behind the building of the tower, which stood at the heart of the city of Babylon. We can read much about the ultimate fall of Babylon (mystery or spiritual Babylon) in Revelation 18, when the rebellious ones are finally judged.

In Heb 3:7-II Paul encourages us not to harden our hearts to the word of God just like the children of Israel did in the wilderness who as a punishment God swore they would never enter His rest.

Paul encourages us to examine our own hearts for signs of unbelief and rebellion against the Lord. We can pray as David did in Psalm 139:23-24, "Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my concerns. See if there is any offensive way in me; lead me in the way everlasting". We can read His word which is alive and can discern our thoughts and intentions and as Derek Prince once said, "When we read the Word, the Word is reading us!"

On a final note of encouragement, even those 'rebellious fools' referred to in psalm 107, when they humbled themselves and cried out to the Lord He sent His word and healed them. God will always bring us back to the authority of His Word and over and over in that chapter it reminds us of His constant loving devotion.

So let's join with the 24 elders in heaven singing "Worthy are You to take the scroll and open its seals, because You were slain, and by Your blood you purchased for God those from every tribe and tongue and people and nation. You have made them to be a kingdom and priests to serve our God, and they will reign upon the earth."

There is only one worthy to receive Glory and Honour. We belong to Him,
