

AN ATTITUDE OF WORSHIP

We come just as we are to God in repentance from our sin, but find it costs us everything as we present our bodies a living sacrifice to Him in return. We become a new creation needing to be clothed in Him and His Holy Spirit. Jesus says we as Christians are the salt of the Earth: what does salt do? It prevents putrification it is an antiseptic. We are in the world to prevent decay and taste good. Because we have a Saviour we taste good. When we are recognized as Christians; people often stop swearing, without us having to say a word, it's about character we are different because of Jesus. We must stop trying to be a Christian. When we are born again we are a Christian. We don't have to try to be a Christian. God puts His emphasis on

our attitude rather than our actions. Being a Christian influences society and brings change around us more than Parliament, Courts or even good laws.

As a Christian our character and disposition is defined in our being Christian not trying through our actions to show we are. We as Christians can by his presence influence and bring change.

Our main purpose is not to campaign for political or social change as a church, we are meant to evangelise, to tell people the good News, not to denounce sinners. Denouncing shuts the door to evangelism. The church's job is to evangelise: If we campaign against a particular sin it puts us in a position that makes it impossible to preach impartially to that set of people, the church must be open to all sinners and point them to lesus.

We should not try to attract people by being worldly like them. People will want to come to Jesus when they see we are different, like lesus was. Our standards should always be His standards.

When we enter His Presence we need to worship Him in humility it mustn't be performing to try and please Him with superficial exuberance. The ministry of the priest in the tabernacle demonstrates the level of purity that entering the Holiest requires. Imagine how challenging it was for the High Priest to enter the Holy of Holies yearly on penalty of death if he got it wrong. He even had a rope attached to his leg I'm told, so they could pull him out if he died in the Holy Place.

Yet we can be so casual in our entry to worship, not realising we are coming before the God who created all things and honouring His Majesty. We must remember He is not like us, He Is God.

Matt 6:8 says, "Blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God". God blesses the purity of heart not the sophisticated head and all its knowledge. God doesn't commune with the intellectual thoughts we have or doctrine or understanding but always looks at the state of our heart. Our heart is the centre of who we are in God, not an emotional feeling; it's the source of our being. It sets our priority towards God. It has to be pure having no guile, out of it, proceeds all the issues of our life. Without discipline we are open to sin, murder, anger, deception, all manner of evil. Men's hearts are deceitful every trouble in the world comes out of someone's heart. eg. Putin, Ukraine! Hitler the Holocaust!

We are Disciples of Christ and the Holy Ghost lives in us to teach us the way we should walk in Him. God always goes before us. His Spirit leads like our Shepherd leads us His sheep. We need to learn to follow wherever He leads. If we are in harmony with 'Gods preceding purpose', God always goes before us, precedes us, makes a path for our walk, he gives us words, visions and dreams. God wants to lead us into the 'Context of his purposes' each day. Jesus said not my will but yours Father, Jesus did nothing without hearing or seeing what his Father wanted. He always yealded to the Fathers will, it was always His context as he walked with God.

We need to be living in surrender within the 'Context of God's will' for each moment; everything we do or say has to be put into the 'Context that the Holy Ghost is directing us to at that time'. Sometimes we sing a song that blessed us before but now we don't experience the same anointing. The anointing of the Spirit always directs us to the 'Context where Gods Is' and suddenly as we sing we pass through the veil in surrender and His Spirit takes over. It's the same with the Words of God, God doesn't give us a Word to tickle our intellect, He gives us Words of life to activate our Faith and do exploits. He leads us into the realm where signs and wonders take place. We have to be sensitive in our approach, to empty our minds of earthly things, so God can fill us with His Faith. We sometimes think its our Faith but in reality it's His Faith manifested by His Spirit in us.

Noak Bridge Church is part of the Churches together in Basildon, which has twenty nine affiliated churches.

It has Anglican, Methodist, Baptist, Catholic Pentecostal and Evangelical members. Its aim is "Changing the spiritual climate in Basildon", it enables the churches to achieve more together than they can achieve individually. This includes the following :-

The school team leading the assembly at twenty three primary schools in Basildon, reaching 10,000 children. Some schools also ask for support in teaching their RE lessons. These young children frequently hear about God's love for them, how we should treat each other and the values to live by, a good start in their life.

Providing hot meals to the homeless each night of the week throughout the year, supported by volunteers from across the Churches and held at several Church premises. The numbers are increasing since the end of last year.

One Church has opened all day so that the homeless have somewhere warm and secure to stay. On a Sunday most of those people, join the service at the Church or go to another Church's service.

Members of the Churches also the support the running of a Night Shelter for the homeless, over the winter period, numbers attending are increasing again.

The Churches, also provide volunteers to support a number of initiatives in Basildon, Mentors for young people at the senior schools, School and Street Pastors, Befrienders for Christian Against Poverty and food banks at a number of Churches. Pastors meet for monthly prayer meetings. Regular prayer breakfasts are held, praying for the local community and activities of the Churches in Basildon.

We often speak about being part of the body of Christ and our different roles in the church, but this extends to the whole body of Christ, as it says In Romans 12 v 4-6 it says:

For just as in one [physical] body we have many parts, and these parts do not all have the same function or special use, so we, who are many, are [nevertheless just] one body in Christ, and individually [we are] parts one of another [mutually dependent on each other]. Since we have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, each of us is to use them accordingly. We must pray that these Churches will put aside their theological Blessings

differences and expand their future evangelical outreaches in unison. Please pray with us for a revival in Basildon, not just at one Church but all of them! Andrew Churchill

Sharing the Good News of Christ is not just a command, but a privilege. Jesus said in Mark 16:15 "Go into all the world and preach the Gospel to all creation."

We are very grateful to everyone who has borne the team up in prayer either by joining with us to pray in Church before stepping out on the street every month or covering us with prayer during the time of reaching out to people in Basildon town centre. We do not take this for granted at all; thank you for all your support and encouragement. Stepping out to bring the gospel to people is like going to a battlefield. so we need the presence of the Holy spirit.

Every Outreach is different, some day's people are more engaging than others, but every

time we believe the Holy Spirit works in people's hearts. We encountered people who did not accept the fact that God loves them, but rather kept focusing on all the challenges that they faced in their daily lives. Yet they would usually walk away when we tried to engage them in conversation about the love of God. This tells us the Gospel is needed even more, and how much people need to hear that God sent His son lesus to the cross to bear His wrath for sinners, for all of us.

We are never discouraged because there are some who come to us for prayer, and we know that we are planting seeds which we believe in due course will yield fruits. Sometimes other believers come by to encourage us and thank us for reaching out to the lost. This has taught us one thing – we do not know the timings nor seasons of God. We simply must be obedient to His word. Nigel North (Glory man!) has joined us on several occasions and been

> a blessing with his accordion and singing of various glory songs and Christian classics which helps take the Outreach to another level. Nigel speaks often about the love of God and His gift of Salvation. Emphasis is always on the message of the cross. THE UPPER ROOM

A few weeks ago, we came across the phrase "The Upper Room" in the book of 2nd Kings. It has been with me almost daily ever since. So many things happened in an Upper Room. Both Elijah and Elisha experienced the miraculous in an upper room. A divine power was operating there, that not even death itself would be able to resist.

Two women knew the painful experience of seeing their promised sons die in their arms. One was a poor widow, the other a wealthy lady. Whatever our station in life, stuff happens, but the power of God is on hand to help. He is faithful to His word no matter what. These two situations teach us how absolutely our lives are in the hand of God. Both women proved the miraculous power of God in their private lives. I have a feeling we shall see wonderful things happen especially in our homes and families even in the coming year. Our TV channels are full of tragic news where it seems the next generation are being particularly targeted by the enemy......BUT GOD!

Both the young men in the 'Upper Rooms' were embraced and

covered by prayer and the power of the Holy Ghost. God can raise a generation to Life no matter how hopeless it seems. That dark death-filled upper room became a place of Resurrection Life. In the book of Acts, another young man called Eutychus fell from an upper room, but he also knew the prayerful embrace of the apostle Paul and resurrection Life flowed into his lifeless body.

Another Upper Room experience is found in Mark 14v 12-15 where Jesus told His disciples "to go into the city and you will meet a man carrying a pitcher of water, follow him". This is a type of the Holy Ghost and if we follow Him, He will always guide us to where our spiritual thirst is quenched, in the text, this was "to a large upper room furnished and prepared".

How wonderful that even here we meet with a finished work, nothing to do but to enter in. Heaven is a prepared place for a prepared people. "Enter in" is the cry of the Spirit. The only striving we need to do is the striving 'to enter in to His rest' (Heb 4:10). When we get the perspective of the Upper room, things look different. We are seated together in heavenly places in Christ. We might not always feel like it, a bit like when we alight from a boat onto dry ground, we can sometimes feel like we're still on the sea but we ARE actually on dry ground...terrafirma. In the same way "Ye are no longer in the flesh but in the Spirit" old habits and ways of thinking are difficult to let go of but this doesn't change the fact that we ARE in the Spirit.

Later that evening in the upper room, Jesus spoke at length to the CHURCH ending in His High Priestly prayer. So much to say about His actions prior to this where in washing the disciples feet, he met with some strong characters and false humility in this act of pure love. (but maybe that's for another time). Ten days later that same Upper Room experienced a cyclone from heaven that changed the world forever. Tongues of fire from heaven fell upon each one gathered there and none of the disciples were the same again. You couldn't shut them up no matter where you put them. They had such a heavenly perspective on life that lifted them above their circumstances and only one thing mattered. Heaven was more real than life itself.

The apostle Paul experienced a revelation that took him to the third heaven and showed him things that were not lawful for him to speak about. No wonder he prayed that we should receive the spirit of revelation in the knowledge of Him. He wanted those early Christians and us, to know who they were and what they had got in Christ. That heavenly perspective! We are people of the Upper Room even today. Our view of life and current circumstances look different from up there. A new problem requires a new sitting down with Him. He works and we let Him. How wonderful. We are seeing more of God working when we hand over to Him. No sense in us both working.! I'll only mess it up, won't I ?? Blessings Julia Elliott

David the Psalmist in Psalm 16:11 says "You will shew me the paths of Life; In Your presence is fullness of joy, at Thy right hand there are pleasures for evermore"

When I was a teenager, I went with my family to Newark, to experience the Glory outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

Henri gave me a book by E.W.Kenyon called "In His Presence".

This book opened my eyes to God's great provision in Christ, for us His family; that we are now "partakers of His divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust". (2 Peter 1:4)

He hath purchased for us a great salvation; the Greek word is SOZO, which includes healing, deliverance, protection through His death, resurrection and ascension after which He sent the Holy Spirit, to reveal to us the wonders of this "so great" a salvation.

Ephesians 2 says "we were raised with Him and are now seated with Him in heavenly places far above this world system and blessed with every spiritual blessing".

He said "My joy I give unto you" The joy of the Lord is our strength. The more joy. the more strength. Luke 24 Two men on the road to Emmaus said," Did not our hearts burn within us while He walked with us on the way and opened to us the scriptures". Oh that He would have this communion with His people.

They knew Him when He broke the bread to them.

The answer to every known need is in His presence; waiting on the Lord, ministering to Him. In Genesis 18, Abraham ministered to the Lord when He appeared to him at Mamre. He refreshed the Lord. David said Psalm 34 "I will bless the Lord at all times, His praise shall continually be in my mouth". We also can

bless the Lord and live in His conscious presence.
